Fundraising Calendar

The banners donated to the school by the Edinburgh International Book Festival arrived in late November. As fencing around the football pitch and nursery garden areas are due to be replaced this year (hopefully over the Easter holidays) the banners have not been hung yet. We'll hopefully



be able to get these up ahead of our Summer garden party to add some much needed decoration to this area of the playground.

Road Safety Banners

Parent Dave Pratt has offered to paint some banners to remind parents and carers not to stop on Brand Place for drop off and pick up. Dave will be using materials left over from the AiR mural in front of the Janitor's house area and the rear of 2 of the banners donated by the book festival. These will hopefully be ready soon.

The Abbeyhill skills register is now ready and live on the Parent Council website. The skills register was first proposed a year ago to give members of the Parent Forum and wider Abbeyhill community an opportunity to tell us about skills they would be willing to share. It is hoped this will make it easier to find people with the right skills to help with Events, Projects and other Parent Council activities and will play an important role in helping to rebuild our community of volunteers post-Covid.
